

Restoring the Wendover Arm Of the Grand Union Canal



The Wendover Arm provides a scenic and tranquil route from Bulbourne to Wendover. It was built as a feeder to provide much needed water to the Tring summit on the Grand Union Canal. For a small additional cost the canal was made navigable and was opened in 1797.

Unfortunately the canal soon suffered from leakage and by 1870 over 30 locks per day were being lost. Despite many attempts to stop these leaks, the canal was closed to traffic in 1897 and stop planks were installed at Little Tring. The Arm was permanently closed in 1904 and the water supply was diverted by a pipeline running under the dry bed of the canal.

The Wendover Arm Trust was formed early in 1989 to raise funds and to actively work to restore the Wendover Arm to full navigation.

Phase One of the restoration, the replacement of the filled-in bridge at Little Tring and the restoration of a short length of canal beyond, was completed and opened to navigation early in 2005.

Although the Trust has been very successful in raising money for this restoration effort our funds will rapidly dwindle as we continue working on Phase Two - the restoration between Little Tring and Drayton Beauchamp.

We need to hire equipment and purchase construction materials so that our volunteer work force is able to complete this work.

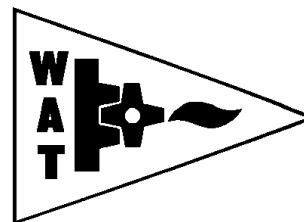

Club 100 Rules

1. The name of the Club shall be ` Club 100 `.
2. The object of the Club shall be to raise funds for the Wendover Arm Trust.
3. Prizes will be drawn four times per year, in January, April, July and October.
The total prize money each year shall be approx 50% of the total subscribed in that year.
Prize allocation for each draw, based on a Club membership of 100, shall be in the proportion
1st Prize - £120, 2nd Prize - £50, 3rd Prize - £20
If applications are received for more or less than 100 subscriptions, the amount of the prizes will be increased or decreased proportionately.
4. The Club shall be run on an annual basis.
5. Club 100 is open exclusively to current members of the Wendover Arm Trust.
6. Each subscription shall be valid for four consecutive prize draws.
7. Subscriptions will be fifteen pounds per year.
(Members must be over 18 years of age.)
8. A member of club 100 may have more than one subscription.
9. Each additional subscription will count as an additional Club 100 member.
10. If the membership of the Wendover Arm Trust lapses, the membership of the club 100 scheme will also lapse. Any monies paid will be treated as a donation to the Trust.
11. All winners will be notified by post and the results will be published in the Wendover Arm News.
12. Administration of Club 100 will be controlled by the Council of the Wendover Arm Trust.
All decisions of the Council shall be final and binding on all questions relating to its operation.
