Over the five years to 2019, members shopping through Easyfundraising have raised £2500, a few pence at a time – but it all adds up and it was without effort or cost on their part.

The map overleaf shows the Arm and its current state of restoration. The Trust has about 800 metres still to restore and to have a canal in-water (but not all navigable) from Bulbourne to Wendover for the first time in nearly 120 years.

The cost of restoring the last 800 metres is likely to be over £1,000,000, then there will be 31/4 miles of navigable waterway from Bulbourne Junction to Drayton Beauchamp

navigation back to Wendover (see our
